

**Memo of Agreement Regarding Articulation
Between Penn State Abington and
Montgomery County Community College**

PURPOSE

The Pennsylvania State University, on behalf of Penn State Abington, and Montgomery County Community College establish this Memorandum of Agreement Regarding Articulation to facilitate the matriculation of students from Montgomery County Community College to Penn State Abington of The Pennsylvania State University. The purpose of the agreement is to provide a pathway for students who have successfully completed an associate degree program at Montgomery County Community College to transition to a parallel baccalaureate degree program at Penn State Abington. The agreement defines admission criteria and processes, evaluation of transfer credits and academic advising services to support students in their transition from Montgomery County Community College to Penn State Abington.

PROCEDURES

A. Admissions Requirements

Students apply to Penn State by submitting the Penn State undergraduate admissions application and official transcripts from Montgomery County Community College and any other colleges or universities attended. The admissions application fee will be waived if a Letter of Intent is submitted to Penn State Abington.

Students must complete an AA, AS, AAS or AFA transfer degree program that corresponds to a Penn State Abington major as shown in the attached transfer charts, be in good standing, free of probation, and have a minimum grade-point average of 2.00 to be eligible for admission to Penn State Abington. Criteria for transfer admission may also include successful completion of specific course requirements.

GPA is calculated from all attempted and completed courses from Montgomery County Community College and from all colleges/universities previously attended. The GPA will be calculated using all courses and grades, including repeated courses.

The Penn State majors included in the terms of the agreement are detailed in Attachment A. In addition, the agreement will include a specific program-to-program articulation for RN to BSN (NURN), authorized for delivery at Penn State Abington by the College of Nursing.

Majors not specified in Attachment A, including majors at other Penn State colleges and campuses, are not covered by the terms of this agreement. Therefore, students admitted under this agreement who seek to enter a major at another Penn State college/campus would be evaluated based on the advanced standing admissions criteria of that college and campus.

B. Evaluation of Transfer Credits

Montgomery County Community College courses, evaluated as equivalent to Penn State courses or approved as general credit within a discipline and transferred with grades of C (2.0) or higher, will be added to the student's Penn State academic transcript by the Undergraduate Admissions Office. To earn a Penn State degree, a student must earn 36 of the last 60 credits from Penn State.

Transferability of courses not specified in the attached guides will be reviewed following Penn State's established process on a case-by-case basis.

Program-to-program transfer guides outlining the specific course equivalencies and approved substitutions for each academic program are included in the agreement as Attachment B. The guides were developed in consultation with Montgomery County Community College, Penn State Abington discipline-specific faculty, and the College of Nursing Associate Dean and were subsequently approved by Penn State Abington's Associate Dean for Academic Programs.

Credit evaluation for other prior learning activity, for example military educational experience and credit by portfolio, will be assessed according to Penn State policy through the process established by Penn State Abington.

C. Academic Advising and Transition

Penn State Abington and Montgomery County Community College will maintain course equivalency information on their respective websites, and admissions and course articulation information will be made available to students through the transfer advising services at Montgomery County Community College.

Students who intend to transfer to Penn State Abington may complete a Letter of Intent form. This form outlines guidelines and benefits for Montgomery County Community College students should they enter into an agreement to attend Penn State Abington. (Letter of Intent Forms attached.)

Penn State Abington will award renewable, merit-based scholarships to eligible students who have signed a Letter of Intent and have graduated from Montgomery County Community College. These scholarships cannot be transferred to other Penn State campuses. The students' merit will be determined by their GPA as calculated by Penn State.

Penn State Abington will offer an academic orientation to transferring students for the purpose of providing academic advising and orientation to academic and technology resources, student life, career services, financial aid, and billing information.

D. Update/Report/Relationship

Penn State Abington and Montgomery County Community College agree to review the agreement and relevant transfer course equivalencies annually and will each assign an

individual to serve as liaisons for the purpose of monitoring and updating the agreement.

This agreement may be amended, as needed, for specific course or program articulation without affecting the currency of the master agreement.

E. Amendments and Term of Effect


This document constitutes the entire agreement and terms of understanding between The Pennsylvania State University, on behalf of Penn State Abington, and Montgomery County Community College, and supersedes any other prior agreements or understandings between the two parties.

The master agreement will be reviewed annually and revised as necessary. All revisions are to be approved by each institution's official signatories. This Agreement will have a term of one (1) year starting from the last date provided below and will automatically renew for successive one (1) year terms, not to exceed (5) years.


This master agreement may be terminated by either party upon written notice to the other party of an intention to terminate. Such notice will be effective only if given 360 days prior to the intended date of termination.

In the event that this agreement is terminated, curriculum transfer guides, in effect at the time a student first enrolls at the Montgomery County Community College, will be honored for students who complete an AA, AS, AAS or AFA degree program and successfully transfers to Penn State Abington within four years of their first enrollment at the Montgomery County Community College.



*Penn State Abington recommends the MCCC Transfer Option. Many of the courses in the Work Ready Option do not transfer to Penn State Abington's Biology and Science majors because **math and natural science courses for non-science majors do not meet minimum requirements for the Penn State Biology and Science majors**. Also see Notes 1 and 2 on the math requirements.

Note 1: For Penn State's Biology and Science majors, math courses below calculus do not meet requirements for these majors. This math course may satisfy the math requirement for other Penn State Abington majors. MCCC's MATH 190 transfers as calculus for Biology and Science majors.

Note 2: CHE 261 and CHE 262, *combined* (8 credits), transfer as Penn State's CHEM 210, 212, and 213 (8 credits, organic chemistry). These courses are a "Major Requirement" in Biology; they are "Major Support" for Science, General Option (For this Option, suggest PHY 121 and 122.)

Note 3: MAT 131 and MAT 132, *combined*, will transfer as STAT 200, a 4-credit required course for Penn State's Biology and Science majors. (Additional 2 credits transfer as Electives.) MAT 131 alone will not transfer. Or take MAT 130 to transfer as STAT 200.

**The Business major at Penn State Abington has several Options: Accounting; Financial Services; Health Services; and Marketing and Management; as well as Individualized Studies. A separate ACCOUNTING or FINANCE MAJOR is available. MCCC students can also transfer to the CORPORATE COMMUNICATION (B.A.) MAJOR, which requires 12 credits of Foreign Language (to the 202-level).*

Note 1: **BOTH** ACC 115 *and* ACC 116 must be taken to receive credit for ACCTG 211 (4 credits) at Penn State Abington. The additional 3 credits become Electives.

Note 3: MAT 142 *in conjunction with* MAT 131 and MAT 132 meets the Calculus quantification requirement (4 credits) at Penn State Abington. Other college-level MAT courses count as Electives. (But MAT 190 *alone* can also meet the Calculus requirement as the equivalent to Penn State’s MATH 140, 4 credits.) MAT 131 and 132, combined, transfer as STAT200, a 4-credit required course. Also, MAT 130 transfers as STAT200.

Note 4: Penn State suggests one of the following to fulfill both the General Education, Humanities (directly or by substitution), *and* the U.S. Cultures requirements: ENG 211, ENG 212, ENG 246, or THA 114.

Note 5: Penn State has not yet evaluated all Montco courses. MCCC students can request transfer credit after admission by obtaining the syllabus from the academic department and submitting it to credeval@psu.edu. Consult a Penn State Abington transfer counselor for updates and course planning. Because they transfer as the same course, *take no more than one from this list: BIO 120, 121, 151.*

Note 6: Montco students who took ENG 102 prior to July 2015 will receive credit for ENGL202B, so they should not take ENG 117, listed in Semester 4. Both transfer as the same course. Substitute a Scientific Reasoning course.

**The B.A. in Criminal Justice requires 21 credits of Electives, and the B.S. in Criminal Justice requires 24 credits of Electives. As a result, students should consider a Penn State Abington Minor (usually about 18 credits, which can double count with some other requirements). Consult a Penn State Abington transfer counselor for more details and course planning.*

Note 1: In addition to the prescribed major courses, the CJS courses can be used to fulfill either Elective or the B.A. or B.S. requirements. For instance, the Bachelor of Arts Requirement is 9 credits in any Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences, Natural Sciences, Quantification, and Foreign Language. However, the Bachelor of Science in this major requires 12 credits of

“Skills Enhancement Courses” taken in consultation with the Advisor. These B.S. “Skills” courses can be CJS or related POL, PSY, or SOC courses.

Note 6: Take one of the following: AST 120, AST 121, BIO 120 or 121, BIO 140, CHE 131, CHE 151, GLG 115, GLG 120, GLG 121, GLG 125, PHY 115, PHY 121, PHY 151. Because they transfer as the same course, *take no more than one from this list: BIO 120, 121, 151*. Penn State has not yet evaluated all courses, but the student can request transfer credit. After admission, the student should obtain the syllabus (available at the academic department) and send it to crediteval@psu.edu. Consult a Penn State Abington transfer counselor for updates and course planning.

Note 7: For the Integrative Arts major, Penn State requires the equivalent of both ART 101 and ART 102.
