

UE Impact: Prior Learning Assessment

Undergraduate Education's (UE) fourteen units are diverse, yet ultimately work toward the same goal—enhancing teaching, learning, and overall student success. Penn State has a rich history of awarding college credit for learning experiences that occur outside of the classroom. Defined as prior learning assessment (PLA), this learning often comes from life, work, and military experiences. PLA often impacts adult learners, transfer students, and veteran or active duty military students. Undergraduate Education's Prior Learning Assessment office has been leading efforts since 2014 to help students earn college credit for knowledge, training, and professional skills they already possess.

Here's what we know about the impact of PLA on Penn State adult learners.

Penn State was included in a national study on PLA's impact on adult learners conducted by the Council for Adults and Experiential Learning (CAEL) and the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE). Results based on 2011–2018 data.

Nationwide, adult degree earners with 12+ PLA credits saved an estimated \$1,500 to \$10,200 in tuition and 9 to 14 months of schooling.

Here's what we know about the average PLA credits received for military experiences.

Data from fall 2018 through September 8, 2023 was analyzed by Undergraduate Education's Office of Institutional Research.



Not from military schools

Students averaged **10.2 courses** and **29.1 credits**



Military service schools

Students averaged **5 courses** and **16.3 credits**



Basic training

Students averaged **1.8 courses** and **5.4 credits**



3,159 students received credit for military experiences, averaging **17.1 courses** and **51.1 credits** of PLA.

Average from all military experiences, including courses, basic training, military schools/institutes. Students include both veterans and active-duty service.

SPRING 2019

Revised ACUE AAPPM Policy E-8: Evaluation of Military Educational Experiences to improve how military experiences are evaluated.



SUMMER-FALL 2019

Piloted and rolled out of American Council on Education (ACE) military credit recommendation reviews with faculty in CSRS; over 3,100 completed; added summer 2021 to the Undergraduate Transfer Evaluation letters



FALL 2019

Faculty re-evaluated AP, CLEP, DSST, IB, and A-Level exam equivalencies



FALL 2020

Revised ACUE AAPPM Policy E-6 and E-7; combined to include all exams as some were missing

Revised ACUE E-9; Admissions will send American Council on Education transcripts to faculty for any transcript with associated credit recommendations



SPRING 2021

Revised ACUE A-2 and E-5 for the Transfer 2022 Project (transfer course re-reviews to begin spring 2023) to prevent implosion of the transfer database; PLA, Admissions, CSRS, LionPATH Development and Maintenance Office met every other week to keep the project moving to fruition



SPRING 2022

Revised ACUE E-2 and E-10 to allow for a digital workflow for exams and portfolios; began work in the credit for prior learning application in LionPATH



FALL 2022

LionPATH updated to include student billing for the credit for prior learning application



SPRING 2023

Transfer course re-reviews began for the disciplines who wanted to see the courses every 5 years

Completed a series of training videos for the faculty to highlight the changes to CSRS

Worked with LionPATH Development and Maintenance Office to create the billing functionality in LionPATH for the credit for prior learning application



SUMMER 2023

Worked with users in the colleges/on campuses to refine the credit for prior learning application
